4 Fostering critical spirit and analytical thinking

Through group discussions and interacting with different perspectives, developing the capability to analyze and thoughtfully question texts with depth.

5 Keeping pace with developments & connecting to history

By reading modern intellectual works or analyzing current issues and linking them to their intellectual and historical roots for a deeper understanding of reality.

Club Workflow

- Selects a monthly book in fields of thought, culture, education, history, or literature.
- Members read the book during the month, interacting via dedicated communication groups.
- At month-end, an in-person meeting is held to discuss main themes, exchange views, and share impressions.

Nature of Discussion

- Managed in an open, interactive, and participatory style allowing every member to contribute.
- Focuses on intellectual content, linking ideas to reality and contemporary life.
- Encourages differences of opinion managed in a spirit of acceptance, respect, and appreciation.
